A MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

Dear participants, supporters and friends of KCAC,

Again, we find that we are in lockdown once more. The Delta strain has gone rampant and the State government has called for a total lockdown.

We may have had to close our doors at the Community Centre and in all our other activity locations to comply with the State Health orders however we did not close our caring and our continued support reaching out to many of you who needed our help during these unprecedented times.

Our offices were still manned by a small team of staff to ensure that you can still communicate personally with someone in an emergency.

Other teams were strategized to work remotely still accessible to your needs if you needed someone to speak to

We received many calls from some of our existing members of KCAC and from the general community looking for essential assistance as the lockdown restricted the movement of many who are seniors and who were not able to access shops for food and or essential items.

The added inconvenience for many seniors was the closure of Key banking institutions in Kingsgrove and in the surrounding suburbs which made it all the more difficult for those that are not familiar with technology or internet banking to access their money to purchase food etc.

Staff of KCAC embarked to provide daily phone calls to known members and to those that made contact with us and or were referred to us by other agencies and or from local politicians.

From the daily contact with our members and general community we were able to identify the needs requested

I wish to thank the resilient staff of KCAC for their support and dedication and to the Board for their guidance and support during a difficult time.

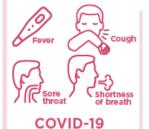
We look forward with much optimism for the future of our organisation and for the community sector as a whole.

"Please support your local community centres and advocate for their existence to your local politicians on a regular basis.

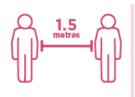

DISABILITY GROUP - MOVIE & POPCORN DAY







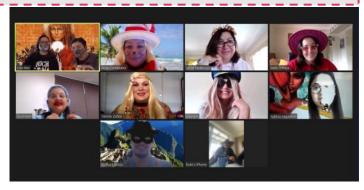

HEALTHY RECIPES TO COOK AT HOME

Spinach Artichoke Pasta Bake

INGREDIENTS

- Onion.
- Garlic.
- Butter.
- Spinach. I used fresh but you can use frozen too. Just allow to thaw and squeeze out excess moisture.
- Cream. Heavy/whipping.
- Sour cream.
- Cornstarch mixed with milk.

- Artichokes.
- Parmesan cheese.
- Mozzarella.
- Lemon juice.
- Salt and pepper.
- Pasta. I used fusilli but any short pasta will work 300 g Arborio rice
- 1 radicchio or 2 red chicory
- 300 g cottage cheese
- 15 g Parmesan cheese



INSTRUCTIONS

- Make the sauce: Saute onions and garlic in butter over medium high heat until soft and translucent. Add chopped spinach then cook until wilted. Pour in the cream, sour cream and cornstarch mixed with milk.
 Allow to simmer for 5 minute then add the chopped artichokes, Parmesan cheese, lemon juice, salt and pepper.
- Cook the pasta and combine with the sauce: Cook pasta (fusilli, penne pasta, rigatoni or ziti) in a large pot of salted boiling water until al dente. Add cooked pasta to the sauce and stir to coat the pasta. Transfer the pasta to a baking dish and top with grated mozzarella cheese.
- Bake: Place in the oven and allow to bake until golden brown and bubbling. Remove from the oven and allow to stand for 5 minutes before serving.

HOW LONG TO BAKE PASTA

If using pre-cooked noodles, pasta bake needs to bake for approximately 20-25 minutes until golden brown and hot throughout. If using raw noodles or pasta, bake for 30-45 minutes until the pasta is cooked through.

CAN YOU FREEZE PASTA BAKE

Pasta bake freezes really well. Assemble pasta bake in foil containers (they freeze perfectly and can go from freezer to oven) then cover with a layer of parchment paper and wrap well with foil. Freeze for up to 4 months and bake directly from frozen until golden brown and bubbling.

Easy Blueberry Muffins

INGREDIENTS

- Oat flour. I make my own oat flour by blending rolled oats in my blender but you can use store-bought too.
- Eggs.
- Blueberries. I used frozen but you can use fresh blueberries too.
- Oil. Canola (preferred) / Coconut / Vegetable.
- Bananas.
- Brown sugar. I used unrefined brown sugar but coconut sugar or Xylitol can also be used. Honey and maple syrup will result in the muffins being sticky and chewy.
- Baking powder.
- Salt.
- Vanilla extract.

INSTRUCTIONS

Make the batter: Place oat flour, baking powder, salt and unrefined sugar into a large mixing bowl. With a fork, mash bananas and add to the bowl along with eggs, oil, vanilla extract and blueberries. Gently fold the wet ingredients into the dry ingredients until just combined.



Bake: Spoon the muffin batter into a lined muffin pan then top each with a few fresh blueberries (optional). Place in the oven and allow to bake for 20-25 minutes until the muffins have risen, are golden brown and a toothpick inserted comes out with moist crumbs. Remove from the oven and allow to cool for at least 10 minutes before serving.

CAN YOU USE FROZEN BLUEBERRIES IN MUFFINS?

Yes, frozen blueberries work very well in muffins. In fact, I prefer using frozen blueberries as I feel they are more consistent in flavor and I know they work well every time.

HOW TO STOP FRUIT FROM SINKING IN MUFFIN BATTER

Coating fruit in a few teaspoons of flour before folding into muffin batter will prevent them from sinking when baking. This batter is a little denser due to the oat flour so I didn't feel the need to coat the blueberries in flour but you certainly can if you prefer.

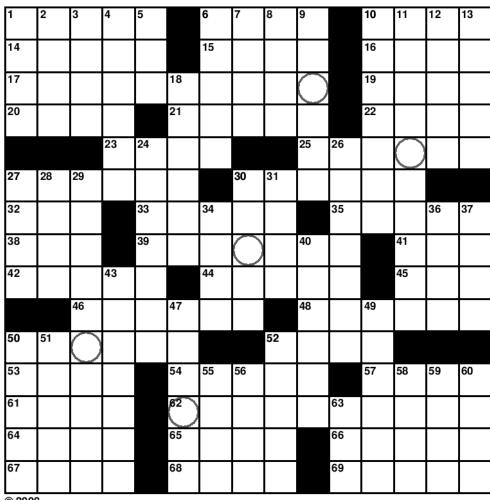

INFORMATION ON ACCESSING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Whilst lockdowns, due to Covid-19, are difficult... information on the financial support available is often confusing. This information is evolving all the time, so checking the www.servicesaustralia.com.au is the best idea. If you require assistance navigating the site, contact Kim in the KCAC office and leave your number... she'll give your contact details with me and I'll try to answer your questions.

When you logon to the site, select your state. There is a Covid-19 Disaster Payment available to financially assist you with two options:-

If you don't get a Centrelink payment (Who can get it, what locations are in lockdown, how much you can get, how to claim and how to advise of any changes to you circumstances. All these options will appear when you choose this option.

If you do get a Centrelink payment (Who can get it, how much you can get and how to claim) Remember, eligibility is important. If you claim a payment and you aren't eligible, you will be required to repay those funds.

One off support payments are also available depending on your situation and the eligibility rules vary for each payment. There if a section on the website entitled, If you need a payment. Here, it gives you the rules which apply to each circumstance. There are Disaster payments, crisis payments and special circumstances payments to help you through this financially challenging time.

It is confusing and it will take time to understand, but if you need help contact Kim in the office and she'll give me your details so I can contact you and help.
