

HEALTHY RECIPES TO COOK AT HOME

Slow Cooker Orange Chicken

INGREDIENTS

- 2 pounds Skinless Chicken Breasts (boneless)
- 4 cups Green Beans (or steamed broccoli)
- 2 tablespoons Toasted Sesame Oil
- 2 cups Orange Juice
- 1/4 cup Chicken Broth (optional no salt added)
- 1/4 cup Coconut Aminos
- 3 tablespoons Honey
- 1 teaspoon Garlic Powder
- 2 teaspoons Fresh Ginger (grated)
- ½ tablespoon
- Orange Zest 1/2 teaspoon Pepper



INSTRUCTIONS

Making orange chicken requires a little bit more steps than many of our recipes, but it's SO worth it!

- Heat oil in pan and cook until browned. While chicken is cooking, whisk together sauce ingredients
- 2. When chicken is cooked, remove from pan and set aside in a bowl.

how to make orange chicken sauce

- 1. Add sauce ingredients to the pot and bring to a boil.
- 2. The sauce should be bubbling and actively boiling for 15 minutes or so until it thickens. Make sure to constantly stir so that it doesn't burn.
- 3. You'll know the sauce is thickened when it coats the back of a spoon.
- 4. Once the sauce is thickened, add the chicken back to the pan and toss until coated.

Healthy Raspberry ripple yoghurt pops

INGREDIENTS

- 150 grams fresh or frozen raspberries
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 2 tablespoons honey
- 1 cup (280g) greek-style yoghurt
- 1 teaspoon finely grated lemon rind
- 1½ tablespoons honey, extra



INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Place raspberries, juice and honey in a medium bowl; crush berries using a fork. Spoon 1 tablespoon of the raspberry mixture into the base of each of six ½ cup (80ml) dariole moulds or paper cups. Freeze for 1 hour or until firm.
- 2. Meanwhile, split vanilla bean in half lengthways; scrape seeds into medium bowl. Whisk in yoghurt, rind and extra honey until combined. Fold in remaining raspberry mixture to form a ripple effect.
- 3. Divide mixture between moulds; insert a pop stick into each. Freeze overnight.
- 4. Dips moulds quickly in hot water; turn out.







